Business type	Sample text
Trade association	If your business uses a chemical, you may need to register that chemical once the UK leaves the EU. To prepare: identify the chemical you use, understand how to register that chemical & prepare for that registration. hse.gov.uk/euexitreach
Chemical manufacturer	Businesses that manufacture or use chemicals may need to register that chemical once the UK leaves the EU. Make sure to identify the chemicals you use and how to register that chemical hse.gov.uk/euexitreach
'Downstream' user (businesses that don't directly manufacture chemicals, but use chemicals)	You may not yet be aware, but if your business uses a chemical, you may need to register that chemical once the UK leaves the EU. Find out more hse.gov.uk/euexitreach
